Regional Vice President (2 positions)

Both positions will assume responsibility for all legislative, regulatory and political matters affecting member companies and their products, services and operations in assigned states. One will be responsible for the Midwest region including Colorado, Kansas, Nebraska, Oklahoma and Texas. The second will be responsible for the Upper Great Plains region including Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Iowa and Minnesota. In carrying out these responsibilities, achieve recognition by public policymakers as chief advocate for interests of life insurers in assigned states. Minimum of 5-10 years of legislative, regulatory and/or lobbying experience and knowledge and understanding of state government required.

Legislative Director (Pacific region)

Under direction of supervisor, assume responsibility for legislative, regulatory and political matters affecting member companies and their products, services and operations in the Pacific region in states including California, Idaho, Nevada, Oregon and Washington. In carrying out these responsibilities, achieve recognition by public policymakers as chief advocate for interests of life insurers in assigned states. Minimum of 2-5 years of legislative, regulatory and/or lobbying experience and knowledge and understanding of state government required.

All three positions require a Bachelors' degree in political science, business, communications or related field. Law degree and admission to bar strongly preferred. Knowledge of and experience in life insurance or financial services industry required. Demonstrated ability to manage legislative and regulatory matters in states with a substantial life insurance market.
